We expect that this course will become an integral part of your working practice.

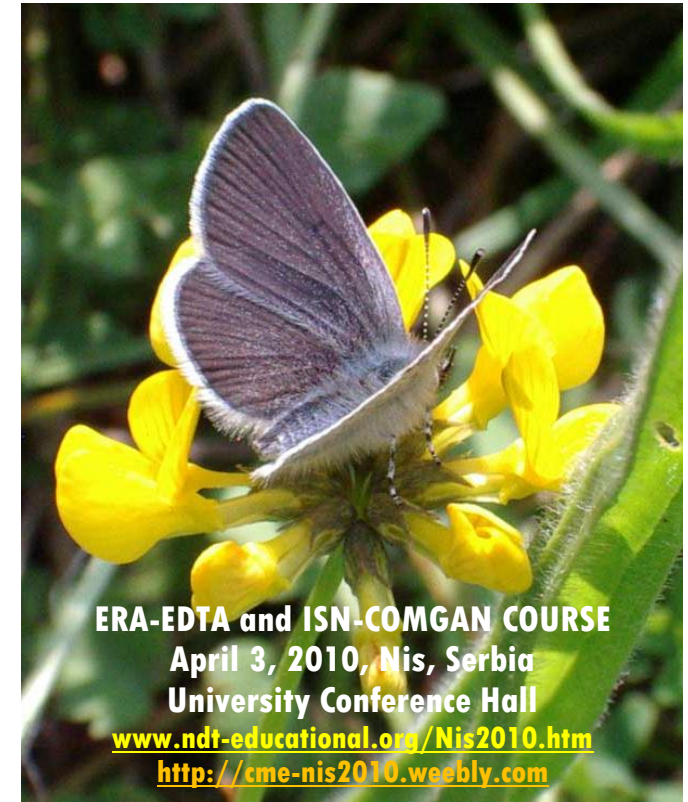
